2019 was a big year for CADA as we celebrated our 40th year serving victims and survivors in south central Minnesota. Over the last 40 years, CADA has provided life-saving and life-changing programs and services to tens of thousands of individuals throughout the region. We are honored to do this work. We are both awed and inspired by the work of those who came before us – what an amazing legacy to be a part of!

2019 brought a number of successes. We celebrated our 40th anniversary with a successful fundraiser, Cupcakes and Beer: Cheers to 40 Years. We were overwhelmed by the amount of support from both sponsors and attendees. This year we were awarded grant funds to expand our services to Martin County, which was the final unfunded county in Region Nine. CADA started as a small grassroots organization and has grown to a large agency providing services to nine counties with over 40 employees. Because of our growth, we created an Assistant Director position. This was done to further ensure quality programming and services for the individuals and families we serve. This will continue to help us provide additional support as our service area expands and the number of individuals we serve grows every year.

CADA is about ensuring that our children can grow up without the trauma of relationship violence or sexual assault. We know that funding sources we rely on are in jeopardy and the cost of services is rising. In 2019, as we moved through our 40th year, we reflected on our past and our roots as an organization. We looked at where we have been and examined where we want to be in the future. In the spring, we wrapped up the strategic planning process.

Our strategic plan for the next three years focuses on:

- Improving what we already do to support the victims and survivors we serve
- Reaching out to people who aren't accessing or aren't able to access our services but may need them
- Working on systems-level change by working with community partners, as well as through prevention and education efforts.

### **Assistant Director and Structure Change**

With the growing number of clients CADA serves each year and our expanding service area, CADA's internal structure needed to grow as well. This year, we created an Assistant Director position. Brittany Wojtowicz, who has been with the organization for seven years, transitioned to the new role in the fall of 2019. The Assistant Director supports and supervises CADA's program managers – the Community Advocacy Manager, Education Program Manager, Keep Me Safe and Offender Education Program Manager, and
